But the Prevention of corruption, the fight against it, which is a threat to the development of society, has always and always been in progress in all states on earth.

Abu Nasr Forabi noted that one of the problems that will be solved in the construction of civil society in the work” the city of Fazil people " is corruption. The same corruption is the system of the market economy in kusanda, the two-and multilateral cooperation between the states, a brutal obstacle in the development of business and investment. Every year at the time of the opening and closing of dozens of joint ventures lay such “invisible hands”. The original reasons why the introduction of foreign investment in a country with a high level of corruption is declining are also similar to those of a dangerous illusion.

Corruption is a wide-ranging concept, it can not be ignored that it has become a daily activity of some layers, categories, groups of society, intertwined and rotted among themselves. "Sensitive", " more confused " on this issue, researchers long ago write about the fact that the law enforcement agencies of the state are somewhat vigilant, vigilant, as well as more active work of non-governmental organizations, various commissions, journalists, the system of independent courts. Politicians, sociologists, psychologists, historians, state and public authorities, political parties and, most importantly, practitioners should be concerned with analyzing the issue and finding solutions.

Let's look at what reforms are being carried out in Uzbekistan in the fight against corruption: Uzbekistan joined the UN Convention on the fight against corruption on July 7, 2008, the Istanbul Plan for the fight against corruption, adopted within the framework of the organization for Economic Cooperation and development in March 2010 (September 10, 2003). Also, the Supreme Assembly ratified the agreement on the Eurasian Group on combating legalization of income and financing of terrorism (Moscow, June 16, 2011) on December 13, 2011.

The law on Combating Corruption came into force in Uzbekistan from 4th January 2017.

In accordance with the resolution of the Republic of Uzbekistan of the law of the Republic of Uzbekistan on Combating Corruption was adopted by the legislative chamber on 24 November 2016 and approved by the Senate on 13 December 2016 and approved by the president of the Republic of Uzbekistan Sh.Mirziyoyev. 2017-th year came into force from 4-th year. Control over the execution of this decision the Prime Minister of the Republic of Uzbekistan A.N.Aripov and the Prosecutor General of the Republic of Uzbekistan I.B.Abdullaev was charged. This law is an expression from Chapter 6 and Article 34.

According to the law, the Prosecutor General's office, the State Security Service, the Ministry of Internal Affairs, the Ministry of Justice, the Department for combating taxes, currency crimes and the

legalization of criminal incomes under the Prosecutor General's office carry out activities to combat corruption in the Republic.

The state program on combating corruption in 2019-2020 and the updated composition of the Republican interdepartmental Commission on combating corruption are intended to be approved. It is envisaged that the bodies of state power and Administration, Public Associations and other organizations will work out effective indicators and agree with the interagency Commission in achieving the objectives of each item of the state program within two months.

The Anti-Corruption Agency, established in accordance with the decree of the president of the Republic of Uzbekistan “on additional measures to improve the Anti-Corruption System in the Republic of Uzbekistan” on June 29, 2020, along with the formation and implementation of the state policy in this regard, should work hard to improve this indicator.

We believe that this should be given importance to one factor, that is, the legality of the withdrawal of money when buying real estate should be checked. However, we do not even ask where the owners of very expensive houses have the money to buy or build them (in 2021 the declaration will be filled out, until then the property can be transferred as much as possible to “other”).

Many experts note that the real discrepancy in the middle is 25 — 40 times, given the “hidden economy”. The poor population that is currently living below the living minimum is 15 percent. A big shake has been observed in this matter since 2019, even though a whole ministry is working, the difference in the middle can make different opinions appear in the layers of society.

We believe that the gradual introduction of the Anti-Corruption System of internal control (“complayens-control”) in all state and economic management bodies in 2020-2021 will give impetus to radical changes in the sphere. In order to fulfill the requirements of the International Convention, the agency is entrusted with the duties and powers of the National Coordinator of the Republic of Uzbekistan for coordination of activities in this direction, the development of the “road map” to improve the position of our country in the international ratings, will serve to increase the status and prestige of the office

It means that bold steps are being taken to eliminate corruption that is becoming an obstacle to national development. The main thing is that no matter how the law-enforcement agencies act in the fight against corruption, we cannot organize an effective struggle against this scourge unless our people establish impressive public control, without compromising this disgusting act.

Of course, in our country, too, drastic measures are being taken to combat this evil. Studies have shown that the most effective means of eliminating a malady is the struggle with the cause, and not with the malady itself.

The fact that corruption becomes a serious obstacle in the implementation of both political and economic reforms in our country is of concern to the public. Therefore, the processes of democratization and modernization of the Society initiated by our compatriot continue with difficulty. The task of bringing into life any political, economic reform of our state, to make the people prosperous remains on paper, while the corruption schemes in the country, they want to quickly get rich without labor, uz the “chain” of methods is cut off.

The issue of corruption and national development — the fate of the country and the future of the country-is more important and relevant than ever. The reason for this came the period when the people of our country were working day and night in order to restore the place of material and spiritual wealth lost during the centuries of colonialism, to develop the economy, to preserve the national identity.
